Dear Rev. Showalter:

It certainly was nice talking to you the other day and I thought I should get this letter off to you explaining perhaps a bit more than I did on the telephone.

First, my certification ran out in December 1988 and I have not renewed it.

The Thew Collection - it was my collaborator, Mrs. Fred Clarenbach, who was in touch with a Thew descendant who has this data. As I recall it was a lot of genealogical data gathered in the mid to late 1800's. As far as I know it has not been deposited in any library where it would be accessible for research but will check further with Mrs. Clarenbach on this and if any change will let you know.

Elmire Langlois Conklin of Warwick NY has been in correspondence with me for quite a few years and most helpfu. Her father Thomas Langlois spent a good many years gathering Mosher data and she has supplied us with copies of his work. I put Elmire in touch with her cousin Wilma Johnson and I have been in correspondence with Wilma also. These two people got together a couple of years ago and I have pictures of them. I also have pictures of Sarah Ann Whipple, wife of Thomas and of William Whipple Mosher, their son; some graveyard pictures of various members of this early family. They came from either Elmire or Wilma. I also have Cornelia Marion's birth, marriage, death and children which you probably have by now.

You mentioned Mayflower and you do know that you have at least four lines? I am on the Board of Assistants of R. I. Mayflower and expect to become the new Historian in April for R. I. Mayflower.

Thomas Mosher's father Gideon Mosher m. Isobel Potter who was a daughter of William Potter, Jr. and Elizabeth Mosher. Elizabeth's grandfather Joseph m. Lydia Taber who was a daughter of Philip and Mary Cooke; Mary Cooke was a daughter of John Cooke who came on the Mayflower with his father Francis Cooke. John Cooke m. Sarah Warren, daughter of Richard Warren of the Mayflower. Gideon Mosher's grandfather Thomas Mosher m. Hannah Davol, daughter of Joseph Davol and Mary Soule; Mary Soule was a granddaughter of George Soule of the Mayflower.

If you have any trouble with documenting these lines use your vital records; Mayflower Families Through Five Generations, Vol. 3 and Mayflower Families in Progress for Warren and Cooke; Descendants of Hugh Mosher and Rebecca Maxson Through Seven Generations.

If there is anything I can do to be of assistance don't hesitate to contact me.

Rev. Showalter,

Your letter to the library was forwarded to me, as town historian.

There is nothing in my files re MOSHER, but I do have the personal files of a former historian, now deceased.

I did check the early census records for Argyle and found Gideon Mosher only in the 1810 census. His household consisted of:  
1m 1f (over 45); 2m 1f (25-45); 2m 2f (16-25).

New York State did not commence keeping vital statistics until 1880/81.

From the old files in my office, there is correspondence dated 1950 through 1953. The letters seem to have been written by an elderly person and the information is rather confusing, but you may get some help from it.

Gideon Mosher had brothers and sisters: Thomas, Aaron, Rodman, Ebra, Mary and Isabelle (who m. John Todd).

Gideon m. Isabelle Potter, whose mother was a dau of Hugh Mosher.

Thomas Mosher, son of Gideon, m. Sarah Ann Whipple (Whipple is a Greenwich name)

note: the former historian found in Albany "Awards on Claims of Soldiers of 1812" #12412 Gideon Mosher, Loraine Co., Ohio \$57. (no date given)

From the correspondence: After Thomas died, his widow and children went to Henderson Co., Ill. Sarah is buried on lot of her son, Gideon, at Olena, Ill. Her gravestone marked 1796 - 1863.

note: If Thomas were one of the younger males in Gideon's household in 1810, even at 16, that age or birth date of ca 1794, that would "fit" with Sarah's birthdate of 1796. Your date for Thos., b. 1782, would have put him in the 25-45 group if he were still "at home".  
Thomas Mosher had 3 bros: Jonathan, Nicolas(sic), William and at least 2 sis: Betsey and Isabelle.

Ch. of Thomas and Sarah Ann Whipple Mosher: Gideon, William, Ephraim, George, Cornelia, Ruth, Emeline, Mary, Belle and possibly one other dau.

As I said, the letters were most confusing.

I also serve as Washington County Historian, so when I go to my county office (in Fort Edward on Weds. only) I will check there, too.

Those letters mentioned more than once that Gideon died here but burial could have been Hebron or Greenwich - same with Thomas. I did check our Argyle cemeteries and only found a younger generation of Mosheres - Dennis Mosher and wife, Martha Nichols, and their family. I will check Hebron and Greenwich cemeteries next Wed.

If anything further turns up, I will gladly forward it to you.

Thank you for the courtesy of sending a SASE. I appreciate it. Am returning your check and trust this "assortment" of info helps.

Dear Alicia:

The Rev. Douglas K. Showalter of Falmouth MA has four Mayflower lines and is trying to prove one before he can go for the supplementals. We have talked on the phone and had some correspondence trying to find proof that Mayflower will accept.

I told him I would talk to you when I see you but at this point am not sure when that will be so if you will bear with me I will try to explain and ask for your opinion.

He has to furnish proof that Thomas Mosher (MOSHER book pp. 123-4) was a son of Gideon and Isobel (Potter) and that Cornelia Marion Mosher who married Oren Willard Hinman was a daughter of Thomas and Sarah Ann (Whipple) Mosher.

I understand the 1850 census for NY shows Cornelia listed as Permelia so I suggested that he check the 1855 state census to see if her name is correctly listed as Cornelia.

He is going to try for a marriage record of Cornelia (IL 1859) as well as a death certificate (IL 1869) although a descendant of Cornelia's has said there were none on record.

Thomas Mosher married (1) Sarah (Havens) Tefft and had a son Abram who d.s.p. in Greenwich, Washington Co. NY. I have a copy of his will but, unfortunately, the person who sent it to me neglected to put the volume number on it. An enclosing a copy of this will in which he mentions his father Thomas. Also a copy of a deed (again Volume number missing) in which land of Abram's was sold by his half brothers and sisters which lists them and their place of residence and this includes Cornelia Hinman.

There is also a copy of a letter and I do not know if the original still exists or where it is, in which Gideon is mentioned and the relationship of the writer has been named in. This was done by another descendant and her father, Thomas Huxley Langlois, had spent years gathering Mosher data. There were five letters and the top of letter #1 says "Exact copies of letters loaned to me August 10, 1962 by Mrs. L. W. Ross, Stronchurst Ill. Mrs. Ross is daughter of Ester Curry and grand-daughter of Gideon Mosher of Olena Illinois". This would be Gideon Henry, son of Thomas, but the letter refers to Gidon who m. Isobel Potter.

When compiling our book we relied on family records that were passed on to us but it was not always primary source material; but when a descendant, daughter or grandchild passed along information we considered it sufficiently correct to accept, as noted in the book.

Would the enclosed be considered acceptable if other primary sources are not available? Rev. Showalter enjoys doing his own research and I have tried to stir him in directions that would be helpful.

Hi! How are you feeling? Guess this means I won't see you at "group" at Bob Anderson's in Gloucester next week. We'll miss you.

The probate and deed definitely connect Thomas Mosher and Cornelia Hinman okay. I would want to have a cover note on the probate and deed stating which county/district court they came from, even if the volume numbers can't be obtained. I would also want to see the 1855 census regarding the Cornelia/Permelia problem.

The letter is a little more difficult. I would need copies of the first letter with the statement about where they came from and a cover letter from you with the pertinent information about who did what.

Then I would probably want a census "run" for both Gideon and Thomas. Since I don't have the dates for these people, I can't give you an exact list. But I'd want the censuses for Gideon showing that he had a son the right age for Thomas in each year Thomas would have been with his father. Then show Thomas in the same location when he sets up his own household -- and perhaps in the same location as Aron, Rodman, Ebra.

I should think that would do it. I'm returning the copies.

THOMAS MOSHER (1782-1852) was a son of GIDEON MOSHER (1751-1818)

Copy of a 19 Feb 1884 letter which indicates that Gideon Mosher was the father of Isabel (Mosher) Todd, who was, in turn, a sister to Thomas Mosher.

The letter was written by Miss LENORA TODD in North Argyle, New York to her 2nd cousin, ANNA (MOSHER) BAILEY CURRY of Illinois.

Text of letter:

++++++

North Argyle Feb 19, 1884

Dear Cousin Anna

Your of the 8th did not arrive until the 16th. I will hasten in reply. I have been to see Grandma. She says her Father's name was Gideon and his brothers names were Thomas, Aron, Rodman, Ebra. She don't remember what her Grandfather name was. She says if you would write to Harvey Mosher Troy N.Y. that perhaps he could tell you more about it as he was one of Rodmans children and was with them more than she. She says the name Hugh is a very familiar to her but she don't remember if he any way related.

Grandma is well and keeping house herself it makes hard work for us washin, ironing & baking & clea<sup>n</sup>ing with our own work to attend to. We have had nothing but rain since the 1st of Feb not one whole pleasant day yet.

Father Mother & I visited your Uncle John Harsha last week had a nice visit they were all going the next day to see Jennie Willisxon McEacheon. Uncle George Field daughter Ella B. was married the 23rd of Jan-- to Robert Mazwell they have a busy five weeks in Paxton Ill--they are expected home this week.

Many thanks for your inviting to visit you I would like very much to go and will when I can I will keep the invitation until some future time. Mother has been visiting in Saratoga she was gon a week the first time she has been from home to stay in a long time. If there is any thing more I can find out for your father I will do it with pleasure.

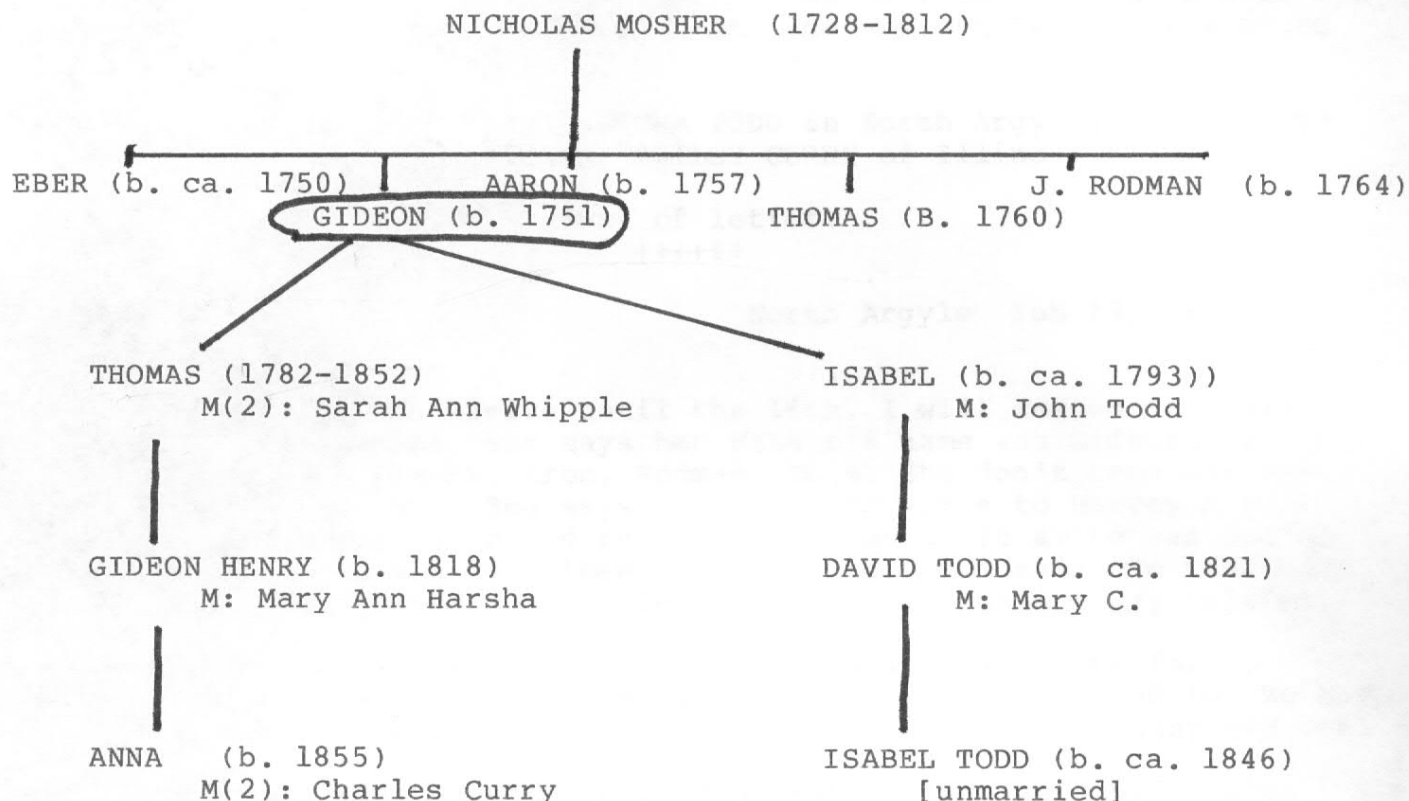

The 1850 Federal census of Argyle, Washington Co., New York on page 163 shows Gideon Mosher (age 31) and his wife Mary A. (age 30) living next door to the family of David C. Todd (age 29) and his wife Mary (age 28). The Todds have a child named Lenora (age 4)--as well as other children.

Twenty two houses away in the same census, page 161, is listed: John Todd (age 57), wife Isabel (age 56), and 5 children [including Margaret B., age 19].

The 1880 Federal Census of Argyle, Washington Co., NY (E.D. 27, page 8) shows the household of David C. Todd (age 60), his wife Mary C. (age 58), and daughter Leonora (age 33). Thirteen houses away in the same census district (E.D. 27, page 6) there is shown Isabel Todd (age 87) and her daughter Margaret (age 49).
